Minutes of meeting held on Tuesday 19th January 2016 in Tong Hall

Mairi welcomed everyone to the meeting and read through the minutes of the previous meeting. There were two alterations noted.

- 1 Norman asked that the minutes should read Pete Middleton spoke to Marten James regarding the generator, not Norman as reported.
- 2 AOCB 5(a) should read Churchill's house and not the crossroads for the reporting of the condition of the road.

AOCB

A Co-opted members – Gordon Macdonald had agreed to become a new co-opted member. Craig Allan, Community Policeman, was also a co-opted member. A request for new members had been put in the Loch a Tuath magazine.

Suggestions about asking the Grazings Committee for monies towards the cost of the steps, and the Councillors said they would be able to give some money from their Ward allocation to help. Challenge Fund Grant could also be used.
