Volunteering in the Western Isles

The Volunteer Centre Western Isles is an independent local charity with offices based in Lewis, Harris, Uist and Barra. We actively encourage, support and promote volunteering in our community and so far a massive 57% of our community have

been involved in volunteering; that's almost twice the national average! This is something we should be extremely proud of as we can proudly say that we have a higher percentage of people volunteering than anywhere else in the country!

This high level of volunteering has inspired us to hold Volunteer Awards ceremony to celebrate and recognise the essential contribution volunteers made by the people and organisations in our communities. This year's ceremony will take place in Stornoway on Thursday 2^{nd} June, during national Volunteers' Week which runs from $1^{st} - 7^{th}$ June.

The event caters for up to 150 people depending on the area and will receive media coverage throughout our communities on radio, newspapers, community newsletters and social media.

Isle of Lewis War Memorial

Comhairle nan Eilean Siar has been awarded a grant of £132k from the War Memorial Trust's First World War Memorials Programme which, together with the Comhairle's capital allocation of £100K, will allow significant restoration and repair works to the Lewis War Memorial.

The Comhairle appointed Simpson and Brown Conservation Architects to prepare and co-ordinate the pre-contract and tender process, with Flemings Masonry Contractors from Glasgow being appointed as the successful contractor.

Comhairle Convener and Chair of the Local Remembrance Group, Cllr Norman A MacDonald, said: "The Lewis War Memorial has been one of the most iconic buildings in our islands since it was opened on Friday 24th September 1924. More than two thousand people gathered that day to witness



the opening of the Memorial, dedicated to Lewismen and women who had lost their lives fighting for their country. Due to its prominent unsheltered spot on the top of Cnoc-nan-uan, the building has suffered damage to its stonework over the years, due to the Lewis weather. It is very important that we maintain such buildings, which are a constant reminder to us all of the sacrifices made by so many islanders and I am very pleased to see that the Comhairle has been awarded a grant to carry out necessary restoration works."

It is envisaged that the works will commence in April 2016, which will result in the memorial being externally scaffolded to allow the restoration works to be undertaken to all elevations.

The external works will primarily consist of stonework pointing, stone replacement where necessary, replacement of 15 slim windows with new louvres and refurbishment of 4 windows on the fourth floor. Restoration works will be undertaken to the three overhanging turrets and the turret steps, entrance door ceiling and slit windows will all be refurbished.

The internal work will primarily involve the removal of existing secondary material (cement render, plaster and paint) to expose the inner rubble stone surfaces to walls.

It is envisaged that the works will take most of the summer to deliver and on conclusion of the works the scaffolding will be left for a number of months to allow for further inspection.

HHP Tenant forum

Local housing agency, Hebridean Housing Partnership (HHP) is host its annual lunch event for Lewis and Harris tenants later this month.

The event will have a particular focus on energy efficiency and HHP partners such as TEAS will be in attendance to provide help and advice on how to reduce energy costs and save money.

Tenants can drop in, have lunch and chat to staff and also view the latest range of kitchens, windows and doors and heating systems being offered to tenants.

Iain MacMillan, vice chair of HHP said "This event provides an ideal opportunity for tenants to get advice on saving money and to see what HHP are doing.

"Tenants can come when they can and leave when they want - the emphasis is on informality. I would urge people to attend. We want to hear tenants' views on their homes and to work together to improve services." There will be an activity corner for pre-school children and a free-to-enter raffle for each household attending.

There will also be information available on services provided by a range of other local agencies and an opportunity for people to talk to officers about issues such as welfare reform and housing costs and worries they have about these.

HHP have appointed the Tenant Participation Advisory Service, (TPAS Scotland) to work with tenants and to help them get involved in how services are delivered.

The event takes place in Stornoway Town Hall from 12 to 2pm on Friday 27th May.

COOKS CORNER

Summer Cheesecake

Ingredients

175g butter 250g caster sugar 4 large eggs 200g self-raising flour 50g ground almond 75g full-fat natural yogurt 2 tsp vanilla extract 250g strawberry hulled and sliced handful flaked, toasted almonds For the cheesecake blobs 200g full-fat cream cheese 25g caster sugar 1 large egg

Method

Method

1.Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Grease and line the base and sides of a deep 23cm cake tin with baking parchment. Mix the ingredients for the cheesecake blobs together in a bowl until just combined – be careful not to overmix or it will become runny. Set aside.

2.Put the butter, sugar, eggs, flour, ground almonds, yogurt, vanilla and a pinch of salt in a large bowl, and beat together until smooth using an electric hand whisk.

3.Scrape half the cake mixture into the tin, then scatter with half the strawberries. Use the back of a teaspoon to create dips in the surface of the cake and dollop in spoonfuls of cheesecake mixture – saving about half for the top. Cover with the remaining cake mixture, being careful not to disturb the cheesecake and strawberries below. Scatter with the remaining strawberries and spoon on the remaining cheesecake mixture, using the same method as before.

4.Scatter with almonds and bake for 50 mins-1 hr or until a skewer comes out clean. Cool for 20 mins in the tin before turning out. Delicious served warm or cold.
