Eilean na Marbh archeaological survey

Kevin Murphy the CNES archaeologist now has all the papers.

Alex John asked about whether the site could be made wind and water tight as the

excavation area was still open.

**Police Scotland issues** Jane Nicolson had come along to the meeting as the Police Scotland representative.

Danny was unavailable.

Jane advised that Point was still a relatively crime free area, and in the period since the last meeting there had been 7 reported incidents. These included RTA, speeding, animals on

road, noise and nuisance and child protection.

She highlighted the 101 service as the communication link for any minor crime issues, and

999 as the emergency number.

Scottish Fire & Rescue Service (SFRS)

Poster awaited for the shop, but otherwise no issues.

**Defibrillators.** Aird community centre: Kit on site awaiting power connection

Post Office hill. This was major work in small areas, involving a large crew from

Breedons.

The issue of the Bayble area roads was raised yet again. Our councillors have this in hand

as an active complaint.

It was highlighted that the increased tourist traffic was placing a strain on our infrastructure including roads.

# Co-option of additional PCC members

Our three councillors are now fully involved in CNES work including membership of the various CNES committees

They have set up a Facebook page which they will be using to act as a noticeboard for their ward activities, and also an interactive messaging system.

Alisdair brought us up to date with developments in the area.

#### Iolaire centenary.

The event to remember the Iolaire disaster will take place next year and plans are now in place to ensure that the memorial site and the access roads and paths are upgraded to a suitable standard. It is expected that the event will attract national and even international press coverage, so the memorial requires work done.

Norrie advised that numerous parties are already involved including the Stornoway Trust (as landlord), An Lanntair, Sandwick community council, CNES and others.

## **Treasurers report**

Eddie had left notes regarding the following.

The account for the paint for the coastal path markers had been paid (£221.00)

He was delighted to report that our accounts had been submitted to CNES and signed off as correct on 12<sup>th</sup> May 2017.

Norrie had receipts from the WIIGA which Lewis will pass on to Eddie. They covered the sponsorship from PCC for a total of £300.

In future it was agreed that any WIIGA funding would not be made to individuals, but to the main organising body.

## Broadbay locality planning group; Health and social partnership

Agnes updated the meeting on the current situation. Since the project had started to focus on the "Greater Stornoway and Broad Bay" areas it had effectively stalled, due to targets that were unachievable. There is a restart proposed.

There was a need to have specific cases that could be used as templates for action. The Western Isles although having difficulties was getting on much better than other parts of Scotland.

Agnes and Norrie will work together on an action plan for Point.

#### Community Challenge Fund

There was up to £2000 available for specified projects under a 50% funding arrangement. The deadline for submission was  $8^{th}$  August.
