#### 1. Minutes of the last meeting

# 2. Matters arising

#### a) Steinecleit access road

David Macleay spoke with Historic Environment Scotland who pointed out that the road belongs to the Urras. He is to set up a meeting with the district manager. Costs for road are not available yet. Position will become clear when costs are available. Any Urras grant is capped at £10,000.

# b) Upper Shader road junction

Noted, that a CnES roads engineer affirmed that the junction complies with regulations. However, given resident's concerns, it was agreed that Murdo Smith would seek written approval from neighbouring crofters, to write to CnES inviting consideration for the stone walls adjacent to the junction to be realigned when funds become available.

# c) Ballantrushal road shrubbery

Costs for deer proof fencing are a minimum of £9,000. The Deer Commission are to visit the site with Murdo Smith, to discuss ways of protecting shrubbery from deer. Upper Shader and Ballantrushal Grazing Committee is looking to stock fence the eastern boundary of the main road south from Ballantrushal. However, unless the Deer Commission can suggest a less costly alternative to deer fencing, shrubbery plan is on hold.

# d) Clearance of scrapped cars

A map showing siting of scrap cars was shown to council. Third Sector Hebrides has made council aware of Scottish Landfill Fund, which may pay for removal, with end June next deadline.

Council discussed whether burying old vehicles an option. Murdo Smith to contact SEPA ACTION

Proposal that approval be sought from all grazing committees for removal of all scrapedp cars etc. This would be followed up with a letter to all crofters and householders, not individuals, highlighting opportunity to remove scrap cars for free.

David Macleay & Murdo Smith to draft letter to grazing clerks to seek approval of proposal ACTION
