3: The role of the UACC is to strengthen the local CCs. We need to encourage more people to join CCs.

- 4: The Council's continuing budget cuts are really cutting into the bone now, and our bus service is under threat. 'Use it or lose it' seems very appropriate here.
- 5: Loganair are expanding the number of routes and increasing the number of destinations, but is this at the cost of our key services? They may be cutting some of the Stornoway to Inverness Flights.
- 6: Our two new, duel fuel, ferries are still nowhere near being finished, at the current rate it will be 2030 before they get into service.
- 7: There is a seminar planned for housing in the Uists and Barra. We hope this will be in August. Time is running out for HHP to secure the land and start building before the funding dries up.
- 8: The population in the Uists is aging, and there is a desperate need to attract and retain families here. There have been media reports that the Uists are bucking the trend and managing to attract families here, but this is misleading as families are leaving just a quickly. This is a serious problem and needs addressing. We need to formulate a plan to ensure that those in power understand the true position.
- 9: Linoclate School has installed a water station to allow pupils to refill their water bottles instead of buying new bottles. They are asking the CCs to donate £100 towards another water station. The school is struggling to get new staff, despite offering relocation funding and housing.
- 10: The Dentist debacle is still continuing. The danger of the 'hub' is still very present.
