<ul> <li>Estimated costs of supply, delivery and erection of the shelter using CnES supplier was £5,400 including VAT - which was approx £1,800 more than we had budgeted.</li> <li>After a suggestion by JNML to request Harland &amp; Wolff at Arnish to quote for construction of a shelter, we recently obtained a quote of £6,721- which is higher than the Council's supplier had previously indicated.</li> </ul>
