Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The minutes from our meeting held on Tuesday 14th February 2023 were proposed by Margaret-Ann Maciver and seconded by Colin Thompson.

Matters Arising

1. FERRIES

Angus Campbell (chair of the ferries community board) and Murdo Maclean attended our meeting to discuss the poor situation of our ferries. They believe that local voices should have more of a say.

Their aim is to visit every island using a Calmac ferry and to get a written collection of local views for evidence to collate. There is a new contract due in a few years' time and it is hoped by collating these views, it can be passed to CMAL/Transport Scotland so that they can design ferries based on what we need and ways to provide a better service.

Andrew will ask Jayne to advertise this plea in the next Loch a Tuath News.

BCC will get points together and send to Andrew to submit a statement to Angus.

2. POLYCRUB

- It's up! Colin will get a padlock for it.
- Raised beds, planters and a shed will need be looked into getting built. There is around £9.5k left in the polytunnel budget.
- It was agreed that we would kit out the Polytunnel before advertising it. It was suggested to have an open day to show folk and allow an opportunity for them to express their interest in a raised bed.
- It was discussed to have low planters along either side and higher beds in the middle aisle of the polytunnel.
- It will need to have an irrigation water system fitted to feed it. This could connect into the Hut's mains and set an auto timer.
- Colin went to NFU regarding an insurance policy for the polytunnel. It will need to be registered as a separate outbuilding.
- Tom and the community service workers will render and paint the wall surrounding the Hut car park.

Finances

The balance stands at £24,788.30. This includes the crown estate funding and play park monies.

As we already have £4600 available for a playpark project, we could add to this by applying from any available funding applications. We may have a better chance of getting funds for a playpark that already exists and to revamp it. Will speak to lain our development worker about this as he may have contacts to follow this up.
